

The history of the current hut

The 43rd Bristol (St Mary Magdalene) Scout Group was originally formed shortly after Lord Baden Powell's Scouting movement started and has existed since before the First World War.

The hut is built on part of the site of the old Stoke Bishop school, which started as a church school in 1841. In 1860 the land was given to the Trustees of St Mary's church by the Harford family of Stoke House (now Trinity

College on Stoke Hill).

The council acquired the site as church schools were transferred into public control over the first half of the 20th century.



The main school

building was all but destroyed during the German Blitz bombing raids in December 1940, and the school eventually moved up to the current Cedar Park site in 1951.



A long building was transported from Bishop Road and used as temporary classrooms for the school from July 1941. This formed the basis of our current U-shaped Scout hut, with two further additions being added over time – a second-hand

wooden structure, probably ex-military, was brought up from Avonmouth after World War II, with another section being added in the late 1970s.
