

The 43rd Bristol Scout Group has been based at its current site just off Kewstoke Road (down a lane between No.'s 15 & 17) for over 60 years. In that time it has seen many hundreds, if not thousands, of local Stoke Bishop and Sneyd Park children come through its doors... maybe you were even one of them!

For many, Scouting changed their lives, giving them the tools and confidence to face the challenges of the world.

Our aim has always been to actively engage and support young people in their personal development, empowering them to make a positive contribution to society.

The Group is run by a dedicated team of local volunteers who give up their precious free time week in and week out. We now have over 100 registered Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and volunteer helpers using the hut over four different evenings each week with an ever growing waiting list.

What we do

We run a full activity programme across the three sections. Recent examples include:

- Completing a 20km cycle challenge
- > Climbing Fan y Big and Pen y Fan
- Orienteering at Blaise Castle
- Visiting a Sikh Temple... Faith badge
- Worked with the Avon Wildlife Trust



Our problem

Sadly, after over 60 years of use our wooden hut has been professionally assessed as being beyond repair, not fit for purpose and has reached the end of its operational life.

With no other suitable venues available locally, the Group has decided to take action or we could face closure. We are keen to prevent this by the creation of a new modern building that not only meets the needs of the Group but also serves as a facility to

be used by the local community.

Our challenge

To raise £250,000 to build and equip a new sustainable Scout Community Centre on our existing site off Kewstoke Road in Stoke Bishop for use by the Scouts, Cubs and Beavers plus other local groups and organisations.





Project benefits

- 1. The creation of more space with the provision of modern facilities including proper heating, insulation and disability access, and a far safer environment for children.
- 2. Allow us to further expand the Group with new additional Sections to enable us to take on more children aged between 6 and 14.
- 3. Be able to provide a far wider range of scouting activities.
- 4. To provide a building which would be available for use by other local charitable, educational and community groups.
- 5. A new and improved community facility which will be an asset to Stoke Bishop and the children of the area.

Funding

We have already raised £51,000 from numerous sources and ongoing including:

Community Groups: BS9 Arts Trail, Stoke Bishop Garden Society, Cabot Scouts

Local Residents: Individuals, former Scouts and general supporters
